



Summary of key findings






More females responded to the survey than males and a small portion (1%) identified as non-binary or gender fluid. A mix of age groups were represented. First generation Australians (born overseas in selected countries) and second generation Australians (with at least one parent born overseas) were represented but more participants were Australian-born with no parent born overseas ('Other' below).







Strongly agree Agree Disagree Strongly disagree




In 3 or 4 years, do you think that your life in Australia will be...?
